Studies show there is a strong link between hospital admission rates and nursing home placement. Seniors suffer a 23 percent risk of being unable to return home or requiring nursing home placement from even short hospitalizations.

AARP Foundation and Rock Health are looking for digital health startups who work to provide innovative solutions that reduce unnecessary healthcare services and costs for older Americans. Eligible competitors have a good handle on product-market-fit and an ARR (annual recurring revenue) of at least \$100,000.

Some of the challenge's key interest areas include:

- Reducing hospital readmissions
- Avoiding penalties from providers
- Providing post-acute care assistance
- Increasing overall patient satisfaction

Submissions will be accepted until October 2 at 11:59PM PST. The top five finalists will pitch to a panel of judges at an event at the Rock Health office in San Francisco in December 2017. Once selected, the winner will receive a cash prize of \$50K to continue improving the health outcomes and quality of life for low-income aging Americans.
